

From the vicar......

Ah, August!

Long lazy days of summer holidays ahead. Time for relaxing, freedom to rest from the usual things that get us up in the morning . . . unless you have small children that is (It gets better, trust me, I've been there). August seems to take on a different pace though, slower somehow, it's almost as if God goes on holiday too!

God doesn't of course. God never leaves us, is always there for us but will encourage us to take time out from our schedules. Psalm 46 verse 10 says:

Be still and know that I am God.

This Psalm is often used to take the reader to a place of quietness within themselves, a way of finding rest that the mind, body and spirit need. It's God's encouragement to take a holiday or Holy Moment as it were. Perhaps we should look at Psalm like this though.

'Be still' is translated in the Hebrew as 'Let go'. This suggests that we allow God to take the reins of our life instead of trying to keep control for ourselves. The interesting thing is as we let go, little by little even, we find ourselves freed from the constant stresses and anxieties that plague our culture. Fancy, surrendering actually bringing freedom? That sense of freedom is like being on holiday all the time.

So then...

Be still and let it go.

And whatever you do this August may you have a wonderful and blessed time.

²⁸ Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰ Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹ They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³² Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³ Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. ³⁴ While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
