- We are expecting quotes in early July for the roof work and will then be able to start apply for grants. It is likely that the earliest the work will be done is Spring 2025. Please continue to pray for our situation and support our fundraising activities.
- The PCC agreed to support the Mothers' Union national campaign to raise awareness of domestic abuse called RISE UP (Respond, Inform, Support, Empower, Unite and Pray). You may have noticed posters in the toilets. There will be more information in future newsletters.
