## Harvest Festival - Sunday 9th October

This year we are supporting Chelmsford Food Bank, which has been helping those in Chelmsford for over nine years.



Did you know that 1 in 5 of the UK population live below the poverty line? This is set to get worse as the cost of living crisis continues with many front line staff such as nurses and teachers reaching out to foodbanks for help.

Foodbank clients receive three days emergency food parcel. A typical food parcel contains a minimum of three days of nutritionally balanced, non-perishable, tinned and dried foods that have been donated by the local community. Last year, there were 5,160 three-day emergency food parcels given to people in crisis in Chelmsford.

For our Harvest appeal, we will be collecting physical and financial donations:

### Tinned goods:

Baked Beans, Custard, Fish, Fruit, Meat, Potatoes, Pulses, Rice Pudding, Soup, Spaghetti, Tomatoes, Vegetables.

### Other foodstuffs:

Biscuits (packets), Breakfast Cereals, Coffee (small and medium jars), Fruit Squash, Instant Mash Potato, Jam & Preserves, Kettle user items (sweet & savoury), Milk (non-dairy), Pasta Sauce, Powdered Custard, Rice (dry), Sponge Puddings, Teabags (40 & 80 pks), UHT Fruit Juice, UHT Milk.

## 'Gaia'

Chelmsford Cathedral will be hosting the stunning 'Gaia' artwork when it comes to Essex for the first time, from 12-29 October, 10am-4pm and 6.15pm -10pm. Daytime tickets are free and evening tickets cost £4 for adults and £2 for children. Tickets to see 'Gaia' went on sale Thursday 1st September.

Measuring six meters in diameter and created from 120dpi detailed NASA imagery of the Earth's surface, and suspended two meters from the ground, 'Gaia' provides the opportunity to see the planet in its entirety as it slowly revolves in the nave of Chelmsford Cathedral, accompanied by a surrounding sound composition by BAFTA award winning composer Dan Jones.

'Gaia' has been brought to the city with the support of Essex County Council's Climate Action Fund and Anglia Ruskin University who will feature Gaia as part of their first annual Chelmsford Science Festival.
